Talk to Aid War Victims

SUMMIT—William F. Pepper, will discuss the effect of the war on South Vietnam civilians before friends of the Committee of Responsibility To Save War-burned and War-injured Vietnamese Children on May 13 at 8:15 in Summit Senior High School. It will be a benefit for the committee.

Pepper, now a teacher at Dobbs Ferry, N.Y., visited South Vietnam in the spring of 1966 as a free-lance correspondent accredited by the Military Assistance Command in that country and by the government of South Vietnam. He visited orphanages, hospitals and shelters; conferred with cabinet ministers, and leaders of the Voluntary Agency Community and USAID (U.S. Agency for International Development).

The Committee of Responsibility with headquarters at 777 United Nations Plaza, New York City, is a voluntary, non-profit organization which plans to obtain available facilities and services in the United States for restorative treatment and rehabilitation of war-injured Vietnamese children, who cannot be adequately cared for in Vietnam.

The friends of the committee have enlisted the aid of Union County clergymen to inform their congregations about the benefit, and have contacted physicians and others by letter.
